On Your Own Time Canvas 01/30/2023 - 05/12/2023

Expressive, expository, and academic writing experiences to develop a foundation for student rhetoric and composition. Experience planning and drafting multi-paragraph essays through a writing process with emphasis on essay and paragraph structure and the elements of sentence structure. Participation in writing workshop, group work, reading to support writing tasks, and writing from sources. A minimum of three, multi-paragraph essays and a final reflection paper. **Class activities focus on Native American history, as well as issues and concerns for Native peoples today. ENG102 First-Year Composition

(Sec. # 25116) 3 credits

On Your Own Time Canvas 01/17/2023 - 05/12/2023

Emphasis on rhetoric and composition with a focus on persuasive, research-based writing, and understanding writing as a process. Developing advanced college-level writing strategies through three or more writing projects comprising at least 4,000 words. **Class activities focus on Native American history, as well as issues and concerns for Native peoples today. Combines lecture, discussion, and workshop, leading to the production of marketable quality creative nonfiction. Prerequisites: None. CRW150 recommended but not required.

CRW202 The Writer as Witness

On Your Own Time Canvas 01/30/2023 - 05/12/2023

Studio course focusing on writing with the writer as witness of the world: pre-writing, writing, analysis, evaluation, and writing of monologue and dialogue in various formats. Prerequisites: A grade of C or better in CRW150 or permission of Instructor.

ENG217 Personal & Exploratory Writing

(Sec. # 25127) 3 credits

On Your Own Time Canvas 01/30/2023 - 05/12/2023

Using writing to explore one's self and the world one lives in; emphasis on journal writing as a source and inspiration for public writing. Prerequisites: A grade of C or better in ENG101, or ENG107, or equivalent.
