WHAT ARE SCHOLARSHIPS?

A scholarship is **FREE** money given to you to help pay for your school expenses (tuition, dorm room, books, etc.). Scholarships do not need to be paid back, but they sometimes have requirements, such as a minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) that students must maintain in order to continue receiving the funding.

They can be awarded for many things, such as being the first in your family to go to college, being lefthanded, having a pet dog, etc. Scholarships can help you cover the things that Higher Ed does not cover, such as paying for your dorm or meal plan. When applying for a scholarship, sometimes you will be asked to write a personal statement or submit a letter of recommendation.

It is important to give yourself plenty of time to work on the application before the deadline. You can find a list of scholarships and search engines on our website. As always, if you need help finding and applying for scholarships, feel free to reach out to Higher Education staff.

- → Fall Semester: JUN 30
- → Spring Semester: NOV 30
- → Summer Semester: APR 30

Changes to the 2024-2025 FAFSA

Completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) can be daunting. Here are some major changes to be aware of:

- The 2024-2025 will not be available until December 2023. (It used to open in October.)
- You will utilize your (or your parent's) 2022 tax information.
- The number of questions is smaller: 36 (from 108 previously).
- The Student Aid Index (SAI) will replace the Expected Family Contribution (EFC). It will make it more user friendly for students and parents to understand the FAFSA awards.
- There is a new student demographic survey you can complete or decline towards the end of the FAFSA application.
